



Findings: Presence / Absence

Over a third of the world's countries - The research has been able to provide confidence on presence / absence.

Individual professional recognition present in 41 locations (40 Countries)

Data available to project gave confidence <u>individual</u> scheme <u>absent in 35 locations</u> (33 Countries), but organisational schemes may exist



Findings: Presence – Data & Forms

24 of 41 generated sufficient data to analyse

Two main forms of recognition scheme

A) Regulatory (19 Countries + Flanders, Belgium)

B) Voluntary (3 Countries + Hong Kong SAR)



Global Trends

The number of EIA legislative systems with an expectation related to professional expertise has risen considerably in the past 5 years

Increasing competence expectations in wider arena:

- DFID, World Bank ESF, ISO 14001-2015

Newer schemes moving beyond EIA knowledge to place more focus on key IA skills / behaviours

(Sound judgement, Collaboration, Communication, etc)

Regulatory vs Voluntary?

Common Core: Years of experience, academic qualifications, fee, EIA knowledge & skills

Voluntary - all run by professional body

- All have multiple levels of recognition & code of practice
- On-going learning (CPD) evidenced and supported

Regulatory - majority central Government managed


- Levels, Code practice and CPD often absent
- Need for regular renewal (<5yrs)
