#### The Pandemic


- ▶ Near 105 million confirmed cases globally 5
- ▶ Over to 2.2 million fatalities globally
- Numbers likely underreported
- ► 600 year old response keep the sick from the not sick
- Physical distancing abruptly changed how we work, socialize and manage daily life

### IAIA COVID 19 Pandemic Survey


- ► How the pandemic was affecting the practice of impact assessment – the work, and the people who did the work
- ▶ Two rounds May and July-August 2020
- ▶ Respondents: 900 the first survey; 700 the second


Snapshot of the 2<sup>nd</sup> survey


#### Way COVID-19 has most affected work




- I have received stop work orders.

- Only as it relates to travel and inperson meetings.












Regulations/standards/policies will relax temporarily to stimulate the economy

Impact assessment will become more important

There will be no change

COVID-19 will be used to dilute impact assessment permanently





#### Summary

- Reliance on electronic communications <u>may be</u> <u>excluding those on the other side of the digital</u> <u>divide</u>
- Impact assessment rules and regulations may be changing: <u>temporary or permanent?</u>
- Impact Assessment can have a role in pandemic recovery, but <u>uncertainty as to whether the</u> <u>pandemic will be used to bypass normal impact</u> <u>assessment requirements</u>
- Some benefits noted by survey, but indicators of pandemic-associated stress were also reported, a matter of concern
